Manchin Leads in Early Poll for U.S. Senate

Charleston, W.Va. - U.S. Senator Joe Manchin leads two announced Republican challengers by double digits, according to results of the latest MetroNews West Virginia Poll.

West Virginia's senior senator leads Third District Congressman Evan Jenkins by a 50 percent to 40 percent margin; while Republican Attorney General Patrick Morrisey trails Manchin by 14 points, 52 percent to 38 percent.

"Senator Manchin's personality and message resonates with West Virginia voters," Rex Repass, director of the MetroNews West Virginia Poll said. "He's a former two term governor, has been in the Senate since 2010 and has a record in most cases aligns with West Virginia voters."

However, the popularity of President Trump, the left-leaning direction of the national Democratic party, and the increasing conservative nature of state voters have made Manchin vulnerable, Repass said.

Although a Democratic stronghold for more than a half century, during the past five election cycles, West Virginia has become a solid Republican state. "Both Morrisey and Jenkins are potentially strong opponents for Senator Manchin," Repass said. "Morrisey has run two successful statewide campaigns, and Jenkins, a former Democrat, is popular in his congressional district."

A methodology statement and additional results for this edition of the MetroNews West Virginia Poll follows and cross tabulated data will be posted to the wvpoll.com website next week.

Methodology Statement

Results of this edition of MetroNews West Virginia Poll are based on interviews conducted between August 11-20, 2017 with a sample of 400 likely voters in West Virginia including registered Democrats, Republicans, Libertarian, Mountain Party, and unaffiliated or independent voters. Data collection methods used included landline phone, cell phone, and opt-in Internet panel. Each data collection method has inherent strengths and weakness.

Likely voters in all 55 West Virginia counties were represented in the survey modeled to the number of registered voters based on data from the West Virginia Secretary of State's office.

When using multiple data collection methods, it is not appropriate to apply a probability-based margin of error to interviews completed. However, applying statistical tests of significance to each question asked at the 95 percent confidence interval yields an overall statistical error of +/- 4.9 percentage points based on the 400 interviews. The 95 percent confidence interval varies by question.

The purpose of the MetroNews West Virginia Poll is to provide a snapshot of opinion and timely voter views in the Mountain State. The media sponsor of the West Virginia Poll is MetroNews, the statewide radio network owned by West Virginia Radio Corporation.

Rex Repass is director of the West Virginia Poll and president of Research America Inc. Mr. Repass is responsible for questionnaire design, the respondent screening and selection process, data tabulation, statistical analysis, and reporting of results.
